Smokey the Bear began as an advertising idea over 60 years ago. In 942 the men who worked in the forests in California were worried about ne number of fires destroying the forests.

They did not have the money or the people to do a good job of ghting forest fires. They did not have enough equipment either. They had n idea.

If they could find a way to remind people to be more careful, maybe he number of fires would be less. Many artists and writers worked on leas. None of them seemed just right.

At last, in 1945, everyone agreed that an animal should be used. If he animal they chose could stand upright, it could use its paws and front egs to show ways to prevent forest fires.

Of course, a bear seemed just perfect.

A well-known artist, Albert Staehel, was asked to draw the bear. He
lrew the bear wearing overalls and an old style ranger's hat. The very first
loster showed the bear pouring water over a campfire. It said, "Smokey
lays - Care will prevent 9 out of 10 forest fires."

The friendly bear became a well-known character to millions of Americans. They paid attention to Smokey's messages. Very soon the number of forest fires became less.

Smokey was seen on posters, bumper stickers, and in magazines
und newspapers. His message was always the same: "Take care of our
vonderful forests."
